Real Heroes

- James 2
- Who do you think of when you think of "Heroes of the Bible?"
 - David in the battle against Goliath?
 - Daniel in the Lion's Den?
 - Sampson with the Jaw Bone of an Ass?
- We look to people who are strong
 - People who have survived against great odds
 - Battled overwhelming forces and won...
- We look to people who have performed great acts
- This weekend we've looked at Abraham
- A man made famous not by a great act...
 - But, by a simple act of Faith
- A REAL Hero
 - That we can relate to...
 - That we can set as an example in our lives

 The act that set the stage for our discussions this weekend was the simple act of believing in God

• Romans 4:18-22

- 18) Who against hope believed in hope, that he might become the father of many nations, according to that which was spoken, So shall thy seed be.
- 19) And being not weak in faith, he considered not his own body now dead, when he was about an hundred years old, neither yet the deadness of Sara's womb:
- 20) He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God;
- 21) And being fully persuaded that, what he had promised, he was able also to perform.
- 22) And therefore it was imputed to him for righteousness.
- Abraham had the faith to believe what God had promised him...
 - The Promise of a son...

• Genesis 15:4-6

- 4) And, behold, the word of the LORD *came* unto him, saying, This shall not be thine heir; but he that shall come forth out of thine own bowels shall be thine heir.
- 5) And he brought him forth abroad, and said, Look now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him, So shall thy seed be.
- 6) And he believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness.
- Paul continued in Romans to explain to us that the idea of having your faith imputed to you for righteousness isn't unique to Abraham
- We also have that same principle applied to us...
- What do we have to believe in order to have it imputed to us for righteousness?
 - That God gave his only son to die on our behalf...
 - For the remission of our sins
 - That we are "justified" by the blood of Christ, and "made right" with God
- And the hardest part...
 - That this gift is given to us regardless of our actions...

- Even if we perform great acts of righteousness, we can not earn salvation...
 - And even if we fail and sin, we do not lose God's gift of mercy and grace
- We can place our self outside of God's mercy by being unrepentant and denying His grace...
 - But, if we focus our lives on following our Lord, and continuing in good works, we will be blessed with the free gift of eternal life
- We have received a pardon that has released us from the prison of death...
 - But, we are not out on some kind of "Probation"...
 - It's not that if we are caught sinning the judge will put us back into Prison...
- We have received a **very special** kind of pardon that forgives us our sins forever...
- But...
 - if you decide that you don't like life on the "straight and narrow"
 - And decide that you enjoyed your old life back in prison better
 - You can go back into prison…
 - And if you make that choice the pardon has no further power over you
- But, if you appreciate the gift you are given, and are so moved by this great gift that you dedicate your life to helping others...
 - You no longer have a to fear the judge...
- In his life, Abraham understood and believed in this same principle
 - Abraham saw the salvation of God
 - He understood it
 - He had faith in it
- That is what motivated Abraham to action
 - That is what drove him to do the great things that are recorded about him
- James speaks to that relationship between works and faith in James 2

• James 2:14-26

14) What *doth it* profit, my brethren, though a man say he hath faith, and have not works? can faith save him?

James 2:14-26 MESSAGE

- 14) Dear friends, do you think you'll get anywhere with God if you learn all the right words but never do anything? Does merely talking about faith indicate that a person really has it?
- The faith in this belief that we proclaim to have...
 - That God raised Jesus from the dead, and through his death forgives our sins
- This faith MUST have some sort of effect on us...
 - It must motivate us to some action...

• James 2:15-17

- 15) If a brother or sister be naked, and destitute of daily food,
- And one of you say unto them, Depart in peace, be *ye* warmed and filled; notwithstanding ye give them not those things which are needful to the body; what *doth it* profit?
- 17) Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone.
- Faith, without works, is dead...
 - Faith in God's ability to extend his mercy to us and justify us in His sight...
 - ... without Actions that are prompted and motivated out of appreciation for that great gift...
 - · ... is dead!
- We have to act!
 - We have to produce something good out of our lives...
 - We can't just expect God to remove all of the Bad from our lives, and like what He sees...
 - We actually have to have made something good out of our lives, so that when He removes the evil... There is some good that remains!

- You see it wasn't SOLELY Abraham's believing God that saved him...
 - He ACTED upon it!
- The promise of a son was what Abraham believed...

• Romans 4:20-21

- 20) He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God;
- 21) And being fully persuaded that, what he had promised, he was able also to perform.
- Abraham believed it so strongly
 - He was so "fully persuaded that, what God had promised, He was able also to perform..." that Abraham was able to act upon those beliefs...

• Hebrews 11:17-19

- 17) By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten *son*,
- 18) Of whom it was said, That in Isaac shall thy seed be called:
- 19) Accounting that God *was* able to raise *him* up, even from the dead; from whence also he received him in a figure.

Hebrews 11:17-19 NIV

- 17) By faith Abraham, when God tested him, offered Isaac as a sacrifice. He who had received the promises was about to sacrifice his one and only son.
- 18) even though God had said to him, "It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned."
- 19) Abraham reasoned that God could raise the dead, and figuratively speaking, he did receive Isaac back from death.
- Abraham had faith that God would provide a son...
 - He had provided a son once even though Sarah's womb was dead
 - He would do so again, even if Isaac was dead…
- He acted upon his faith...
 - As we read about in James 2:

James 2:21-26

- 21) Was not Abraham our father justified by works, when he had offered Isaac his son upon the altar?
- 22) Seest thou how faith wrought with his works, and by works was faith made perfect?
- 23) And the scripture was fulfilled which saith, Abraham believed God, and it was imputed unto him for righteousness: and he was called the Friend of God.
- 24) Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith only.

• James 2:21-26 NIV

- 21) Was not our ancestor Abraham considered righteous for what he did when he offered his son Isaac on the altar?
- 22) You see that his faith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did.
- And the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness," and he was called God's friend.
- 24) You see that a person is justified by what he does and not by faith alone.
- Not by faith alone...
 - God wants us to do doing something with our lives...
- Not worrying about sin
 - He's taken care of that for us
 - But, doing something good and productive...
 - Something useful...

• James 2:26

- 26) For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also.
- God has given us this life for this purpose...
 - We have been made alive
 - · We were dead in our sins
 - He gave us a New Life

- Specifically for the purpose of serving Him with Good Works...
- It is the Useful not the Great that God wants from us...
 - He isn't calling on us to slay dragons and defeat armies...
 - He has chosen us for our weakness to show forth His strength...
- He simply wants us to find useful, helpful, encouraging, uplifting things to do for people to reflect some of the love that He has shown us...
- That is what a Real Hero does...
 - The Useful... Not the Great...
- Let's look at Ephesians 2 to close...
- Ephesians 2:1
 - 1) And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins;
- We used to follow the sinful ways of this world, and walk according to it's path...
 - But, we have been saved from that, and now we walk with God...

• Ephesians 2:4-5

- 4) But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us.
- 5) Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;)

Ephesians 2:4-5 NIV

- 4) But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy,
- 5) made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in our sins it is by grace you have been saved.

Ephesians 2:6-7

- And hath raised *us* up together, and made *us* sit together in heavenly *places* in Christ Jesus:
- 7) That in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in his kindness toward us through Christ Jesus.

• Ephesians 2:6-7 NIV

- And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus,
- 7) in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus.

• Ephesians 2:8

- 8) For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: *it is* the gift of God:
- We meet here this morning to remember that Gift...
 - God loves us so much that He gave us this gift...
- God gave us His only son...
 - To die upon the cross, so that we might live
- Jesus is like Abraham...
 - A Real Hero
 - An example for us in our own personal lives
- Jesus didn't win any great battles
 - Jesus didn't lead his people to a great victory
- But, he believed God's Promise
 - He was faithful and knew that God would raise him from the dead...
- And, he asks us to do the same...
- Because we are created anew with Christ Jesus
- Ephesians 2:10
 - 10) For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.
- We are created anew unto good works...
 - Let us fill our lives with good...
