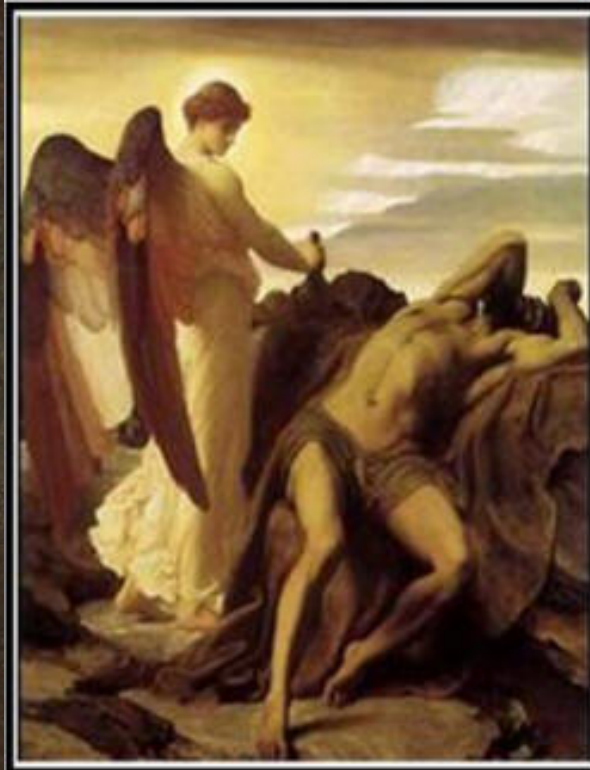

# WHEN Was Daniel Praying?

- Finished on the 24<sup>th</sup> Day of Abib
- Prayed and Mourned for 21 Days
- Started on Abib 3 and ended on Abib 24
- What happens from the 14<sup>th</sup> Day of Abib to the 21<sup>st</sup> Day of Abib?
- **PASSOVER!**

# Fasting?

## Daniel 10:3 MESSAGE

- 3) *I ate only plain and simple food, no seasoning or meat or wine. I neither bathed nor shaved until the three weeks were up.*



# Comeliness into Corruption

- The Hebrew word for “Comeliness” in Verse 8 is *HOWD* - Meaning “grandeur, splendor, majesty, excellency, glory, goodly, honor...”
- Daniel acknowledged his own corruption and sinful nature in the presence of God

# A Man Greatly Beloved

- *Daniel was **BELOVED** because he was sincere with God and had developed a lasting relationship with his Heavenly Father*
