


## Purpose In Your Heart






 Even though he was a Prophet, he still had to study the Bible to find answers


 He didn't just study the Prophecies for some kind of Academic Pursuit, he changed his life by what he learned

 Acknowledging our own fault in a problem opens up the heart of the other person and goes a long way to helping to resolve the problem






A Man Greatly Beloved




- Finished on the 24<sup>th</sup> Day of Abib

## Comeliness into Corruption

 The Hebrew word for "Comeliness" in Verse 8 is HOWD - Meaning "grandeur, splendor, majesty, excellency, glory, goodly, honor..."

 Daniel acknowledged his own corruption and sinful nature in the presence of God
